

**MINUTES
WINNETKA VILLAGE COUNCIL
STUDY SESSION**

June 14, 2022

(Approved: July 19, 2022)

A record of a legally convened meeting of the Council of the Village of Winnetka, which was held at Council Chambers on Tuesday, June 14, 2022, at 7:00 PM.

- 1) Call to Order. President Rintz called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM. Assistant Village Manager Kazenas called the roll of the Village Council. Present: Trustees Rob Apatoff, Andy Cripe, Bob Dearborn, Kim Mancini, and John Swierk. Absent: Trustee Tina Dalman. Also present: Assistant Village Manager Kristin Kazenas, Village Attorney Braeden Llord, Deputy Village Clerk Berina Gradjan, Deputy Police Chief Brian O'Connell, and Police Chief Marc Hornstein, and 0 persons in the audience.

- 2) Public Comment.

Trustee Apatoff, liaison to the Chamber of Commerce, addressed matters regarding the Bike ordinance and informs Council that businesses have strong concerns that young bikers are not attentive to signage and feel that there is a lack of education regarding the ordinance.

- 3) Automated License Plate Readers.

Police Chief Marc Hornstein states that the goals for the Automated License Plate Reader are ultimately used for crime prevention, alerting officers of missing persons, endangered elderly, and AMBER alerts.

Chief Hornstein identifies the various technological features of the Automated License Plate Reader and informs Council on how these features can benefit crime prevention measures by the Winnetka Police Department while assisting surrounding municipalities in crime identification. Chief Hornstein briefs Council on crime rates in the northern and western suburbs as well as the types of crimes committed within the Village.

Marc Hornstein reviews the process of data storage that is obtained, how surrounding municipalities that use the system reference the data, and what the regional approach is with Automated License Plate Reader.

Flock Safety representative and Council review costs related matters, the installation process, software diagnostics, and expenditure.

Council discusses the overall success rate of the Automated License Plate Reader and privacy concerns related to the general public. President Rintz believes that while the Automated License Plate Reader is beneficial, the written policy should be revised and reviewed with the Village Attorney before the policy is implemented. Council consensus was Village staff should proceed with the purchase of the Automated License Plate Reader and work with the Village Attorney to draft an updated policy which addresses the privacy concerns placing clean restrictions on the use of the data and ensuring that the data collected by Flock is deleted every 30 days.

- 4) Adjournment. Trustee Dearborn, seconded by Trustee Apatoff, moved to adjourn the Village Council meeting. By roll call vote, the motion carried. Ayes: Trustees Apatoff, Cripe,

Dearborn, Mancini, and Swierk. Nays: None. Absent: Trustee Tina Dalman. The meeting adjourned at 8:16 PM.
